

TOWN OF LOGANSPORT
MINUTES
May 14, 2013

The regular meeting of the Logansport Town Council was held Tuesday, May 14, 2013, at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chamber with Mayor Katherine Freeman presiding. Council members present: Norman Arbuckle, Judge Cordray, Martha Guillotte, Dale Morvan, and Edith Williams. Absent: None. Five guests were present.

The meeting was opened with the Lord's Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance.

The April minutes were approved as written with a motion from Mr. Cordray and second from Mr. Morvan. All ayes.

General fund bills were approved with a motion from Mrs. Williams and second from Mr. Arbuckle. All ayes.

Utility fund bills were approved with a motion from Mrs. Williams and second from Mr. Cordray. All ayes.

There was no old or new business to discuss.

Brother Frankie Mathis from Cowboy Cornerstone Church reported on the events at the Logansport Municipal Rodeo Arena. He stated in spite of the weather, the St Jude's event held at the arena was considered a success. There were over 50 people in attendance and \$5,000 was raised. All of which went to St Jude's. A "Salute the Troops" event will be held Saturday, May 25th, Play Days for kids 18 years and younger each Saturday in June, a rodeo bible camp in July, and an LRCA rodeo to be held the 23rd & 24th of August.

Code Enforcement Officer, Deborah Roberts, reported she had not been able to get in touch with the owner of property located on Highway 5 at the corner of Williams Street, across from Oak Street and it needed cleaning and cutting really bad. After much discussion, it was decided to have the Town crew cut the property and place a lien on it, which is in accordance with the Town's ordinance #593.

Mrs. Williams requested that the "pot holes" on Ashton Street be repaired.

Mr. Cordray reported the two fish statue displays have been placed and are awaiting electrical work to begin so that they can be illuminated. Everything is looking good and will be noteworthy to anyone passing through Logansport's "Sand Bass Capital".

With no further business to discuss, the meeting adjourned.
