MINUTES
May 13, 2014

The regular meeting of the Logansport Town Council was held Tuesday, May 13, 2014, at 6:00 p.m. at Logansport Town Hall with Mayor Katherine Freeman presiding. Council members present: Norman Arbuckle, Judge Cordray, Martha Guillotte, Dale Morvan and Edith Williams. Absent: None. Four guests were in attendance.

The meeting was opened with the Lord's Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes from 4/8/2014 and 4/22/2014 were approved as written with a motion from Mr. Arbuckle and second from Mrs. Guillotte. All ayes.

General fund bills were approved with a motion from Mr. Morvan and second from Mr. Arbuckle. All ayes.

Utility fund bills were approved with a motion from Mrs. Williams and second from Mr. Arbuckle. All ayes.

Debbie Amox, Christmas Lighting/Festival Chairman, asked the Council to consider placing removable gates at the bridge entrance by the railroad trestle and the bridge entrance at Elm & 2nd Street by the Sub-station during the Christmas Festival. With a motion from Mrs. Williams and second from Mr. Arbuckle it was approved allow Rex Clark, Public Works Director, and Mrs. Amox to get together and decide the best placement for the gates. All ayes.


With a motion from Mr. Morvan and second from Mr. Cordray, Ordinance #694—An ordinance establishing weight limits on municipally owned public streets, was introduced and a public hearing set for Tuesday, June 10, 2014, at 6:00 p.m. All ayes.

With a motion from Mr. Arbuckle and second from Mrs. Williams, Ordinance #695—An ordinance requiring a written permit to transport goods and materials on municipally owned streets when load limit exceeds 4,000 pounds. All ayes.


With a motion from Mr. Arbuckle and second from Mr. Morvan, the Mansfield Enterprise was selected as the official journal for the period beginning July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015. All ayes.

The Mayor introduced Gary Stephens, a representative of ATMOS Energy, to answer questions relating to the possible sale of the Town's gas system. There are so many new regulations and requirements, regarding the sale of natural gas, the Mayor, wanted to explore all options. Mr. Stephens explained how ATMOS had purchased several of the smaller gas companies in DeSoto and the surrounding area. Should the Town decide to explore the option of selling, ATMOS has a list of items the Town will need to furnish to ATMOS, i.e. Financial information, Operation information, System information, etc. No action was taken at this time.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting adjourned with a motion from Mr Cordray and second from Mr. Morvan.
