

MINUTES
TOWN OF LOGANSPORT
February 14, 2017

The regular monthly meeting of the Logansport Town Council was held Tuesday, February 14, 2017 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chamber of Logansport Town Hall with Mayor Judge Cordray presiding. Council members present: Norman Arbuckle, Katherine Freeman, Dwight Gatlin, Martha Guillotte and Pam Thomas. Absent: None. Five guests were in attendance.

The meeting was opened with the Lord's Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

The January minutes were approved as written with a motion from Mrs. Freeman and second from Mrs. Guillotte. All ayes.

Monthly bills were approved with a motion from Mr. Arbuckle and second from Mrs. Freeman. All ayes.

Stacy Cranford, Joe Long and Pat Gray from the City of Joaquin addressed the Council regarding the recent water purchase agreement requesting a lower flat fee per month of \$500.00 instead of the \$750.00 and a lower per thousand gallon charge than the \$5.00.

Under old business, the Council approved to offer the City of Joaquin a flat fee of \$750.00 per month with a \$4.75 per thousand gallon charge with a motion from Mrs. Thomas and second from Mr. Arbuckle. All ayes.

The first item under new business was the introduction of Ordinance #701—Amending the City of Joaquin water rate from Mrs. Freeman and second from Mr. Arbuckle. A public hearing will be held Tuesday, March 14, 2017 for comments.

With a motion from Mrs. Thomas and second from Mr. Arbuckle it was approved to increase the bulk wastewater rate from 3 cents to 4 cents per gallon. All ayes.


Mayor Cordray stated he had been approached about using the Scout Hut for meetings relating to children and their parents/guardians/mentors. These meetings would take the place of Boy Scout meetings since there was no active Boy Scout Program in Logansport. The Council saw no problem with the request as long as there was no liability issue involved.


With a motion from Mr. Arbuckle and second from Mrs. Guillotte the 30 foot gooseneck trailer owned by the Town was declared surplus. All ayes.

Mr. Arbuckle reported that 22 citations were issued and 6 arrests were made during the month of January. A total of \$1158 was collected in fines.

Mrs. Thomas reported that 36 meters had been cut-off for non-payment in January. Services had been restored to 30 after payment was made with 6 still pending.

With no further business to discuss the meeting adjourned with a motion from Mrs. Guillotte and second from Mr. Arbuckle. All Ayes.
